

Supplemental Education Services

What is Supplemental Education Services (SES)?

Supplemental education services (SES) are free tutoring services that must be offered to low in-come children who attend a Title I school that falls to make progress for three years. The tutoring services offer students extra help in academic subjects in language arts literacy, mathematics and science. SES tutoring is provided to students outside the regular school day before or after school, on weekend, or in the summer.

Why is (SES) important?

The SES program offers children who may be struggling in school a change to get the extra academic help and individual instruction they need. Studies suggest that academically based programs offered outside the school day can help students improve their achievement and work habits. Tutoring can help children improve achievement by building on the learning that takes place during the school day. Students at risk of academic failure have the most to gain from tutoring programs. Some of these students may not learn well in traditional classrooms and, through tutoring, can learn in different, perhaps more effective ways. Finally, by helping individual students improve, SES can support teachers' and principals' efforts to improve their schools.

What schools are eligible?
